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## BACKGROUND

### The China Trade Tracker

Launched in 2021 by the China-Britain Business Council (CBBC), the China Trade Tracker is a comprehensive reference offering key facts and figures on UK-China trade – with a particular focus on regional British export trends. It is updated on a half-yearly basis.

Issue Twelve of the Tracker provides an overview of the goods trade between the UK's 12 regions and devolved administrations and China in the four quarters to Q2 2025 (1 July 2024 to 30 June 2025). Unless stated otherwise, references to 'China' in this report include Hong Kong.

### HMRC Data

This report uses HM Revenue and Customs (HMRC) data, which offers a breakdown of UK goods trade by region. HMRC trade totals are slightly lower than comparable data from the Office of National Statistics (ONS) due to differences in data collection and handling.

### Hong Kong Data

This Tracker incorporates Hong Kong to provide a more complete view of UK-China trade flows. It is important to note, however, that Hong Kong functions as an important regional trading hub, so a notable share of goods recorded there will subsequently be exported to other markets.

## Foreword

**Peter Burnett – CEO of China-Britain Business Council**

This edition of the CBBC Trade Tracker – which coincidentally covers almost exactly the Labour government’s first year in office – shows that UK-China trade, not just bilateral contact, regained real momentum in the summer of 2024.

While the government’s renewed focus on engagement delivered a steady cadence of ministerial visits and the reinstatement of trade dialogues, UK exports also gathered pace thanks to the rise of regional trading powerhouses and enduring Chinese demand.

After a period of net decline, this Tracker shows that exports moved firmly back into growth. Over the four quarters to the end of Q2 2025, British goods exports to China including Hong Kong rose **6.4%** to **£22.6 billion**, and **nine** out of the UK’s **12** macro regions recorded growth. Five of these areas saw **double-digit** export growth.

Standout regions included Scotland, where exports surged **79%** to **£2.0 billion**, driven by explosive growth in petroleum exports and an **83%** rise in shipments of salmon, crab, and other seafood. In England’s northwest, high-tech generators and pharmaceuticals underpinned export growth of **43.9%**.

Further south, England’s South West recorded its **fourth** consecutive year of export growth to China and Hong Kong, supported by its production of power-generating machinery, diagnostic tools, transport equipment, and industrial machinery.

As in government relations, however, challenges inevitably surfaced. This Tracker finds that road vehicle exports to China were severely affected in the period surveyed, leading to a **£1.1 billion** reduction in export income, and numerous luxury and premium consumer goods categories also faced pressure in the context of softening Chinese consumer sentiment.

Even so, taking a wider view highlights the progress achieved and opportunities ahead. China’s forthcoming Five-Year Plan, with its emphasis on opening up, innovation, clean energy, and high-quality consumption, signals areas of continued commercial promise for UK companies.

CBBC remains committed to supporting export growth across every region, aligning with the Labour government’s efforts to level up regional economies, and helping British businesses compete and prosper in a complex, fast-moving market.

## China and the UK Economy

Economic links with China are an important pillar of the UK's growth prospects, both now and in the years ahead. According to HMRC data, China and Hong Kong together represent Britain's **fourth** most significant export market, and for many UK companies it remains a market they simply cannot overlook.

There is a natural fit between what the UK sells and what China increasingly wants. Long-established British brands, niche manufacturers, and high-tech producers continue to find an audience in China's mature consumer and industrial landscape. At the same time, the UK relies on Chinese imports to keep prices down for households and to supply key components used across British industry.

The relationship reaches well beyond the exchange of goods. Chinese-owned companies employ over **57,000** people across the UK, and links in education and tourism add another layer of economic value. Students from China are crucial to the financial health of universities across the country, while visitors contribute significantly to the UK's hospitality and retail sectors.

China faces a tough economic environment, from subdued household spending to external frictions that have unsettled global trade. Even so, this Tracker finds that UK goods exports to China still grew **6.4%** in the 2024/25 period, and the IMF expects China to grow **4.8%** in 2025, suggesting that demand may remain more resilient than headline pressures imply.

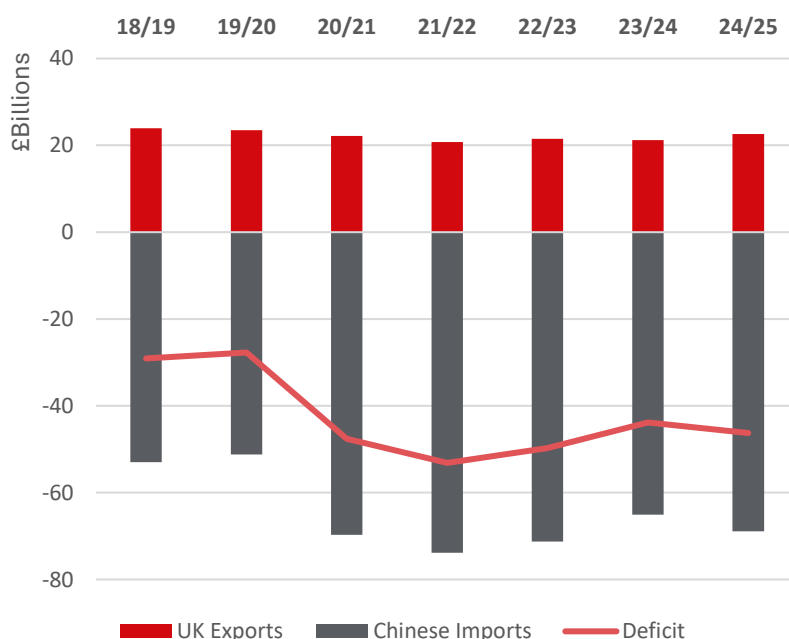

## Executive Summary

The CBBC Trade Tracker provides a snapshot of regional UK goods exports to China (including Hong Kong) in the four quarters to Q2 2025, based solely on HMRC data.

*Key findings in this report include:*

### National-level Insights (2024-5)

- UK goods exports to China rose by **6.4%** to **£22.6 billion**, reversing a **1.2%** fall in 2023-4.
- Of the UK's total goods exports to China, **£13.1 billion (58.1%)** went to Mainland China and **£9.5 billion (41.9%)** to Hong Kong, highlight the city-region's enduring importance.
- The UK's **top** export to China, power generating machinery and equipment, grew **29.8%** to **£6.1 billion**, while road vehicles fell **29.8%** to **£2.7 billion**.

### Regional Comparative Insights (2024-5)

- The fastest growth in exports to China came from Scotland (**79.0%**), England's North East (**43.9%**), England's South West (**20.0%**), and England's East (**16.0%**).
- **Nine** out of **12** UK regions saw growth in exports to China, up from **four** in 2023-4.
- The UK's largest exporters to China were the East Midlands (**£4.0bn**), the West Midlands (**£2.8bn**), London (**£2.8bn**), the North West (**£2.1bn**), and the South West (**£2.1bn**).
- Of all UK regions, **only** the East Midlands ran a trade surplus with China, while England's South East recorded the **largest** deficit.
- Of all UK regions, the East Midlands had the **highest** share of its exports to China going to Hong Kong (**83.5%**), while Northern Ireland was the **most** reliant on Mainland China, with **86.2%** of its China exports directed there.

### Regional Insights (2024-5)

- Scotland's new top export to China, petroleum, grew **2,309%** to **£407.5 million**, while seafood exports rose **83.0%** to **£107 million**.
- The North East's China exports rose **43.9%** to an **all-time high** of **£748 million**, boosted by **50.9%** growth in power generating machinery and equipment.
- The East Midlands' China exports grew for a **fourth** year to a **record £3.98 billion**.
- Welsh exports of power generating machinery and equipment rose **19%** to **£74.3 million**.
- The East saw growth in **seven** out of its **eight** top exports to China and remained the UK's **largest** exporter of medicinal and pharmaceutical products.
- The South West experienced its **fourth** year of China export growth and broke **£2 billion** for the first time, thanks to a **42.4%** surge in power generating machinery and equipment exports.
- London's exports to China fell **11.4%**, easing from the **17.7%** decline seen in 2023-4.
- Major falls in exports to China among UK regions included a **23.2%** fall in Scotland's beverage exports, an **18.4%** fall in the North West's biggest export, road vehicles, and a **64.4%** fall in London's petroleum exports.

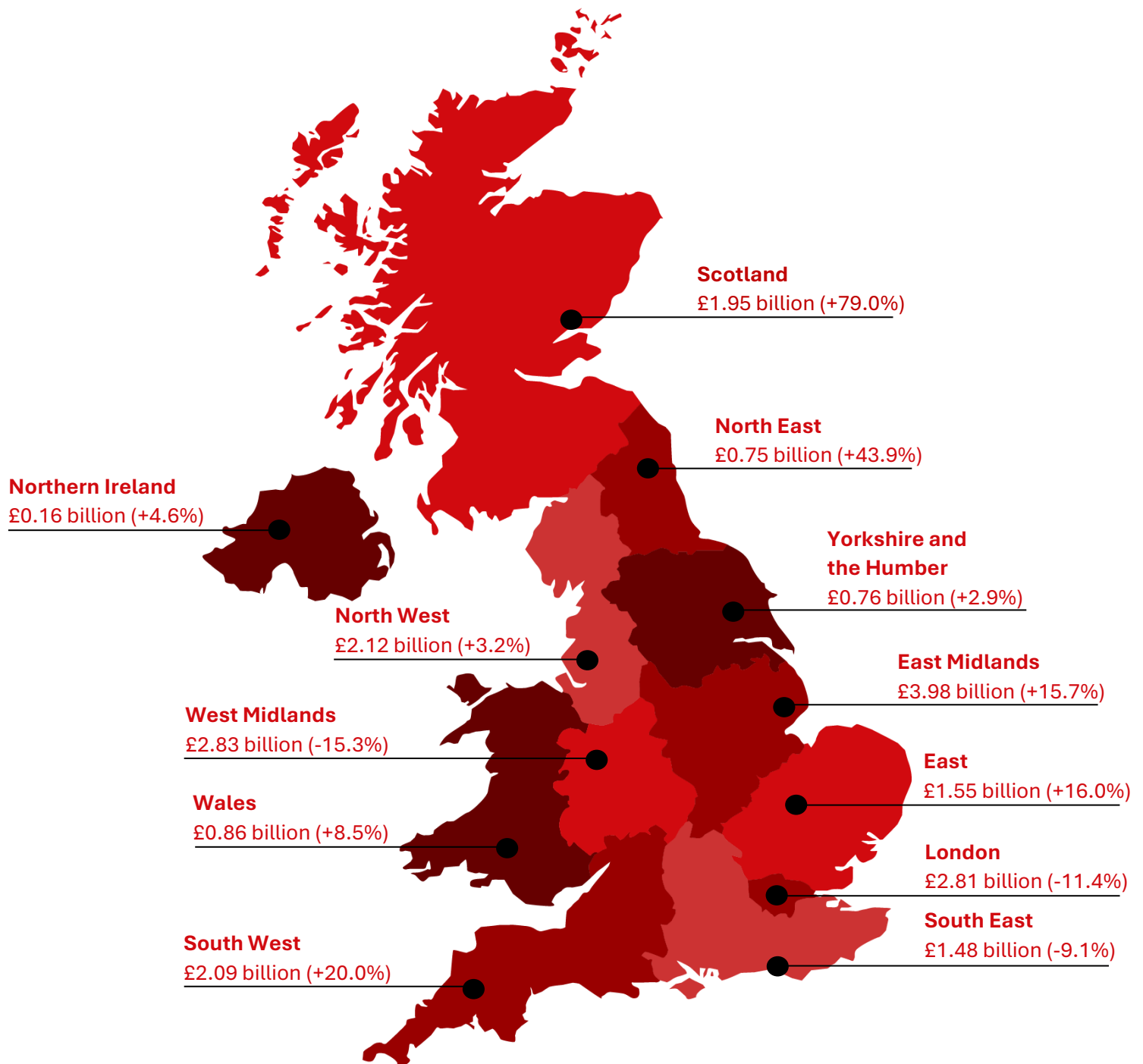

Total Exports by Area in 2024/5 (YoY change)

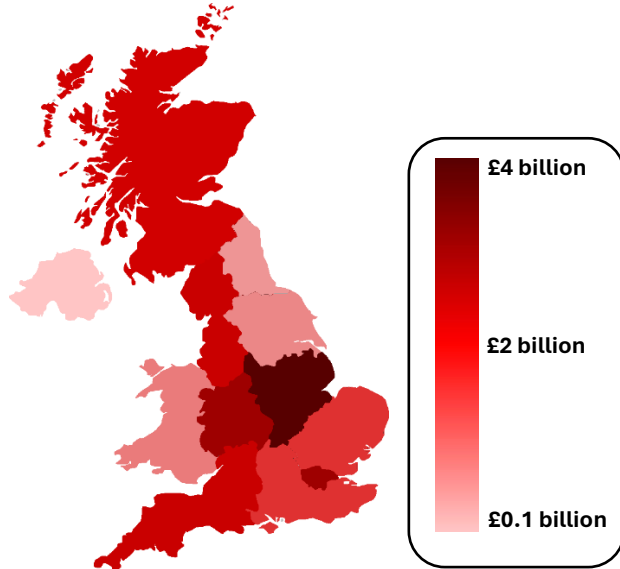

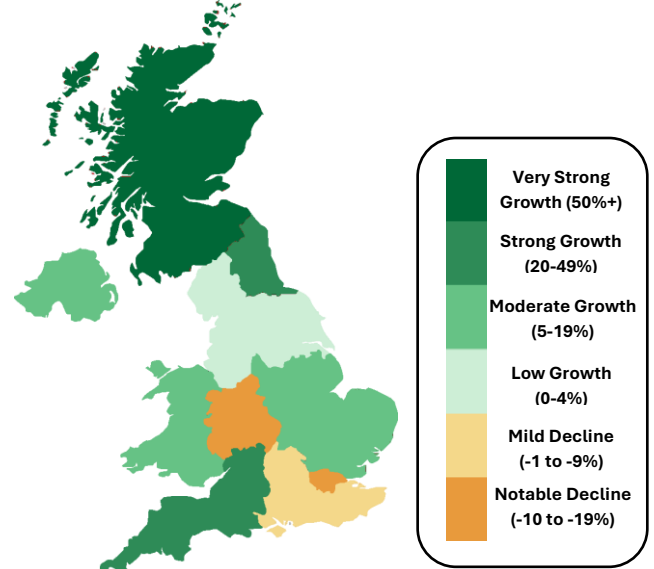

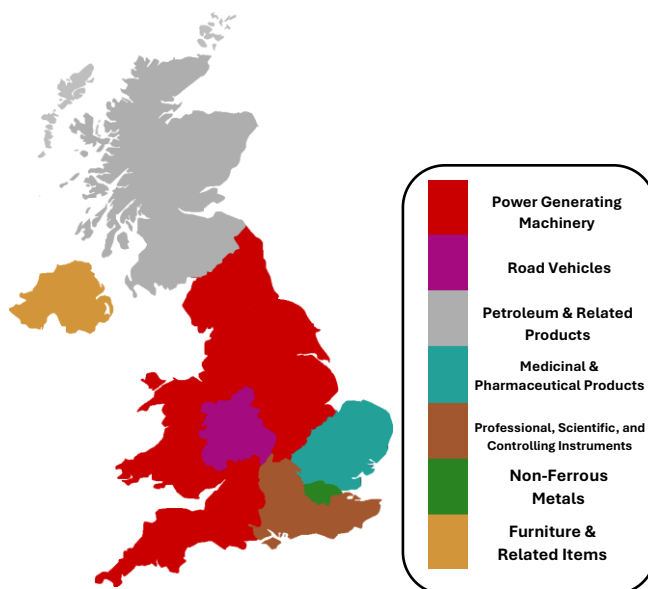

to China: Total Value**



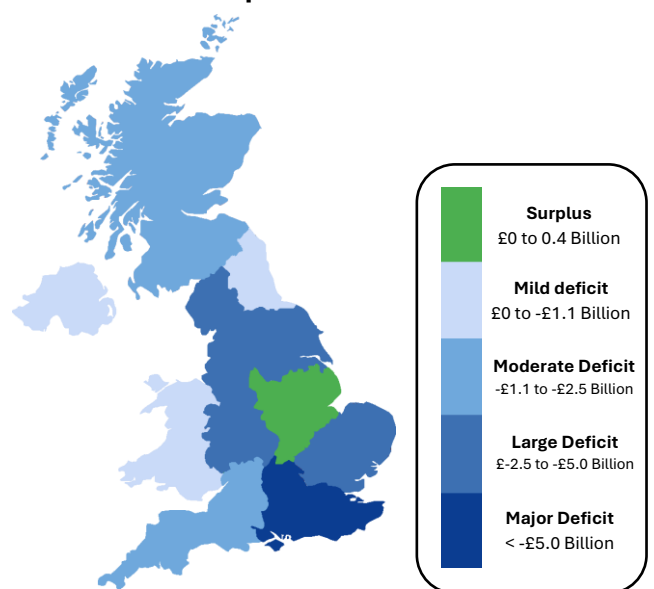
**Goods Exports

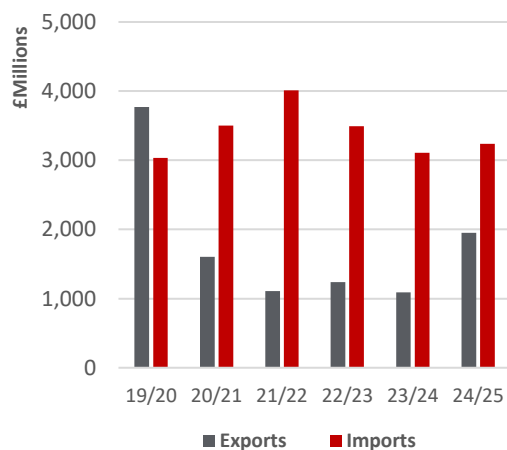

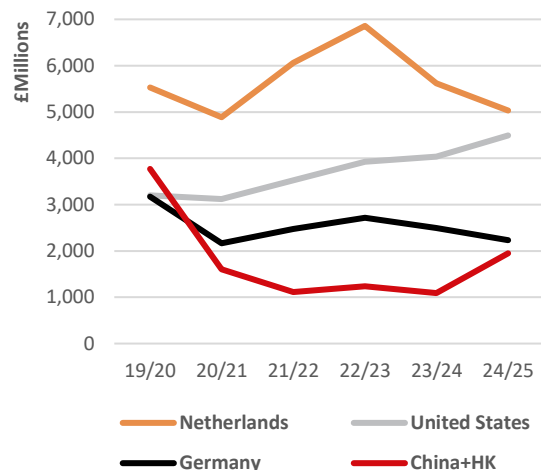
### Trade Insights

- Scotland's goods exports to China (inc. HK) grew **79.0%** to **£1.95 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, the **fastest** rate among regions and the **highest total** since 2019-20.
- Petroleum exports surged **2,310%** to **£738 million**, with possible reasons including rerouted exports (previously via intermediaries) and teapot refineries in China favouring easier-to-process North Sea crude over heavier and sanction-risky Russian oil.
- Beverage exports, mainly whisky, fell **23.2%** on weaker demand and tougher competition.
- Seafood exports rose **83.0%** to **£107 million**, likely driven by the development of cold-chain logistics in China and strong demand for high-value Scottish species.

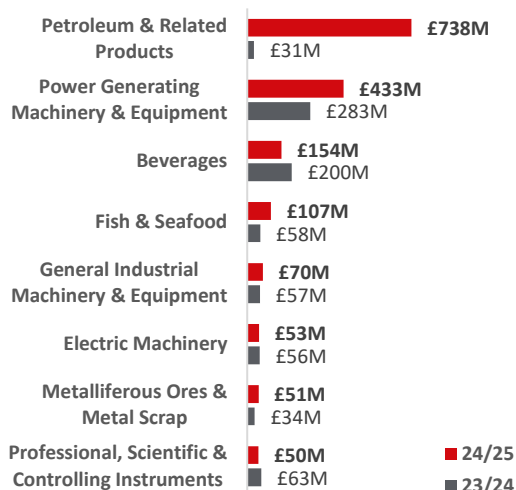
### Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



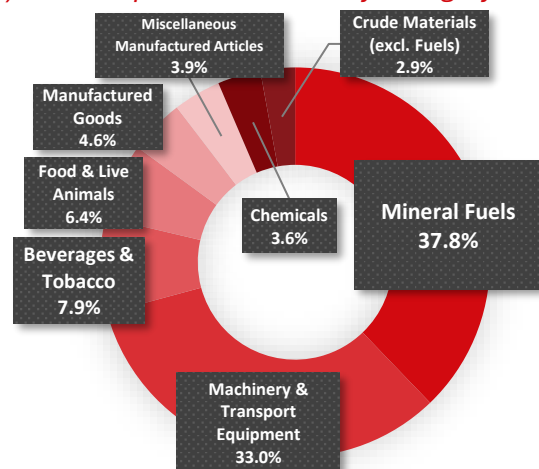
### Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

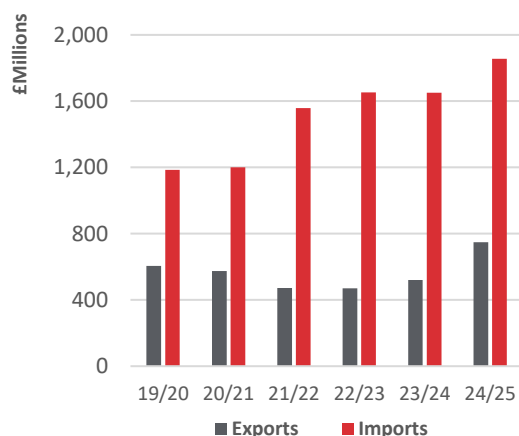

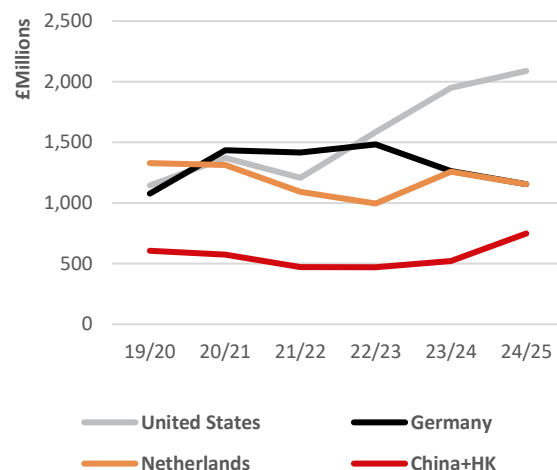
### Trade Insights

- Goods exports from England's North East region to China (inc. HK) grew **43.9%** to a record **£748 million** over the four quarters to Q2 2025, the **second-fastest** rate in the UK.
- Power-generating machinery & equipment exports to China rose **50.9%** to **£214 million**, in part linked to shipments of specialised, high-value generators and related systems from the Teesside and Tyneside offshore-energy and engineering cluster.
- Exports of Medicinal & Pharmaceutical Products rose **315.3%** to **£80 million**, reflecting the North East's strong pharmaceutical base, with substantial manufacturing capacity and specialist R&D in chemicals, pharma, and biotechnology.

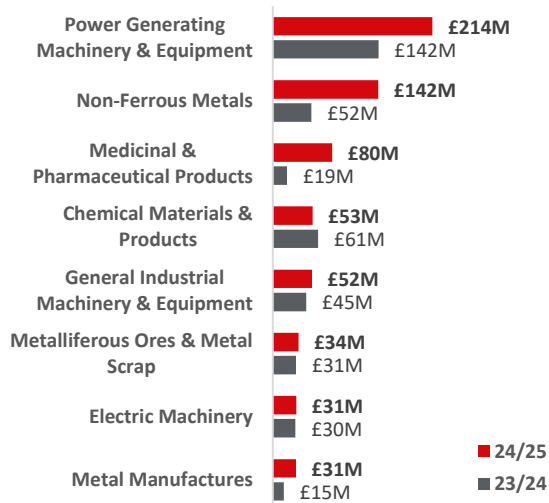
### Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



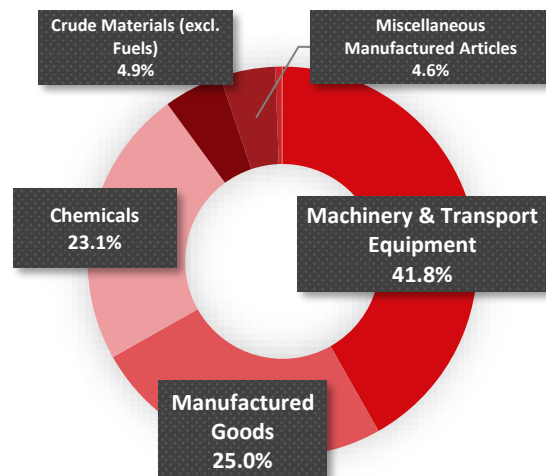
### Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

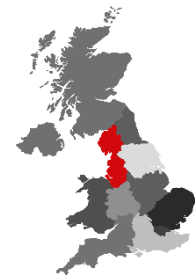

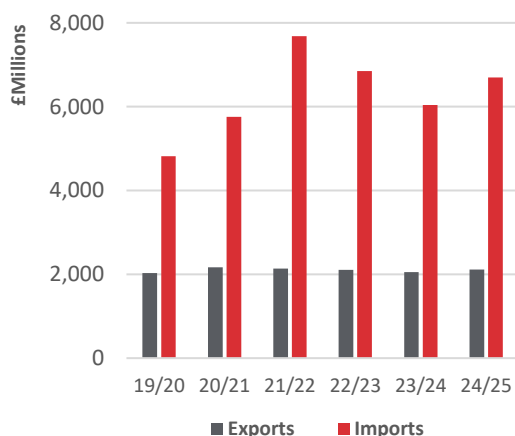

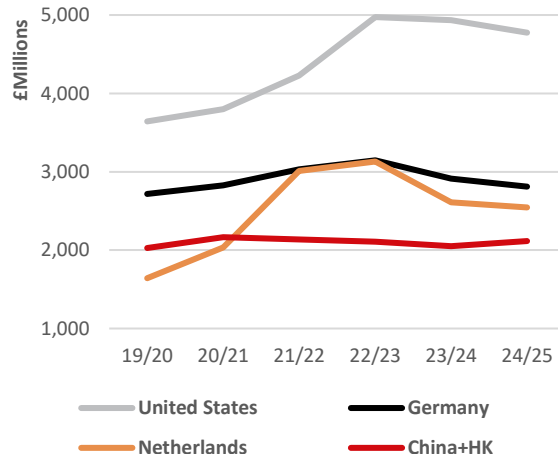
### Trade Insights

- North West goods exports to China (inc. HK) rose **3.2%** to **£2.12 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, making it the UK's **fourth-largest** exporter to the country.
- The region's top export subcategory, road vehicles, fell **18.4%** to **£655 million**, likely reflecting temporary output drops as factories switch to electrified models, fiercer competition from Chinese manufacturers, and softer demand for premium vehicles.
- Machinery specialised for particular industries saw the **fastest** growth among top-8 exports at **195%**, likely reflecting the North West's output of food-processing, packaging, bottling, bakery, and printing equipment.

Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



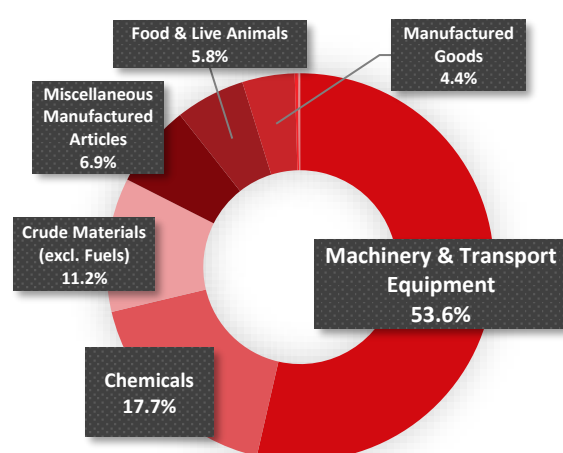
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

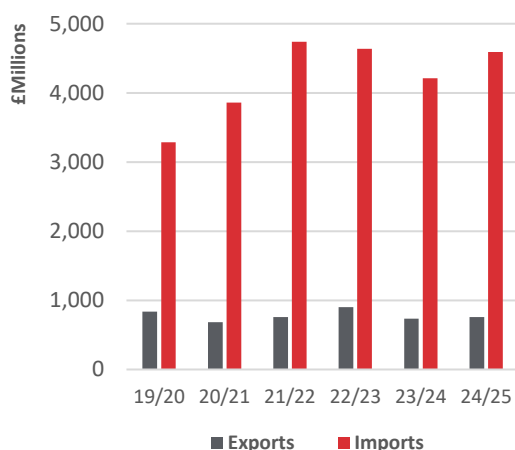

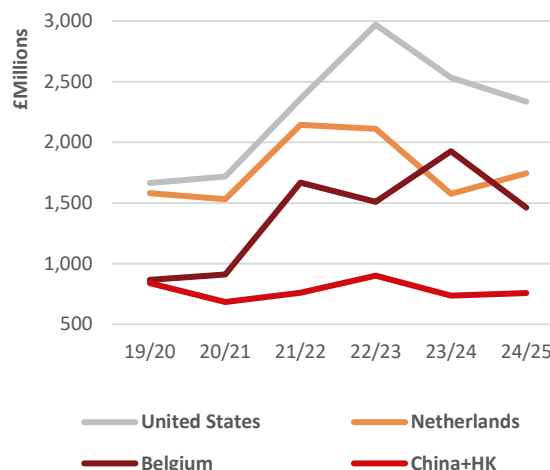
### Trade Insights

- Yorkshire and the Humber's exports to China (inc. HK) rose **2.9%** to **£758 million** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, reversing the **18.2%** fall seen in the previous year.
- Power Generating Machinery exports grew **19.4%** to **£113 million**, driven by increased Chinese demand for turbines, electric generators, and large renewable-energy components produced in manufacturing hubs such as Rotherham and Hull.
- Smaller category success stories included 'dairy and eggs', which rose **167%** to **£1.3 million**, and 'organic chemicals', which increased **112%** to **£5.5 million**.

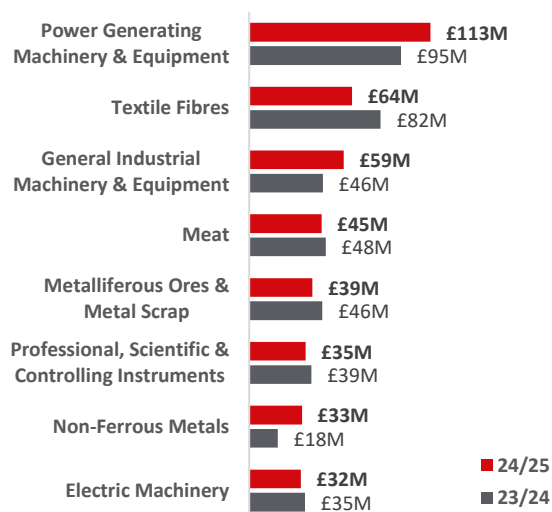
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



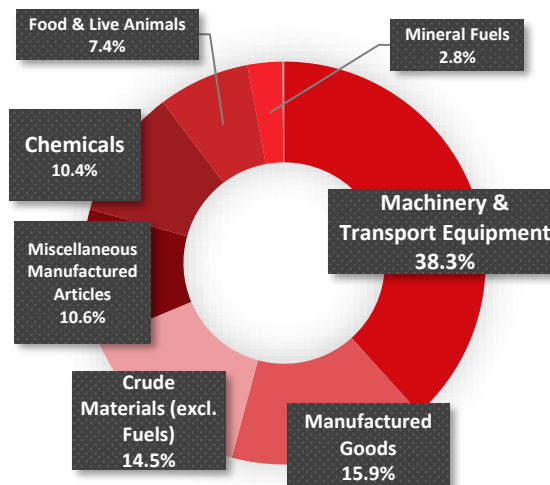
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

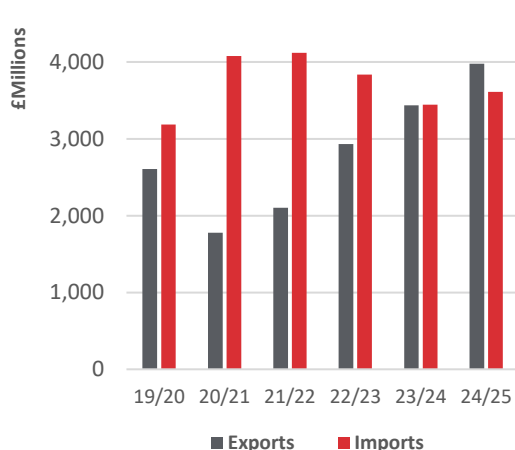

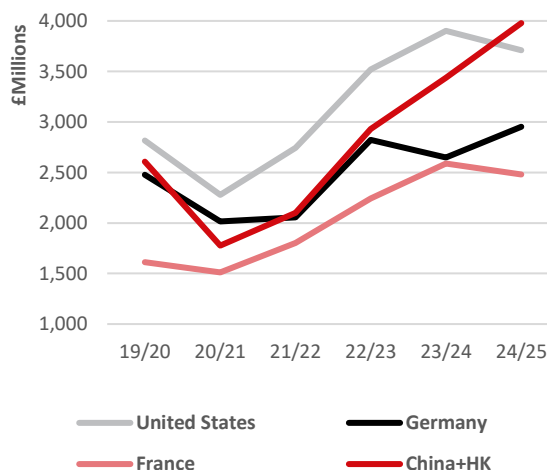
### Trade Insights

- Goods exports from the East Midlands to China (inc. HK) rose **15.7%** to **£3.98 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, the highest export value among regions.
- The East Midlands was the only region to run an **export surplus** with China, and it had the **highest** share of exports to China as a % of GDP (based on the latest comparable data).
- China **became** East Midlands' **top** export market, with **exports** of power-generating machinery (likely referring to this region's production of industrial generator sets, power-generation components, and small-scale wind/off-grid generation equipment) rising to China and falling to the US.

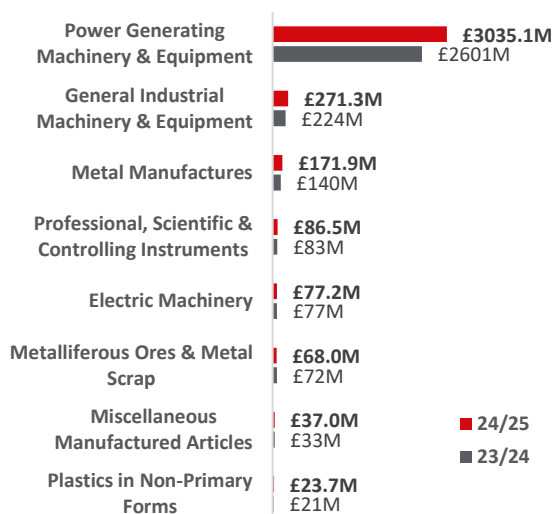
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



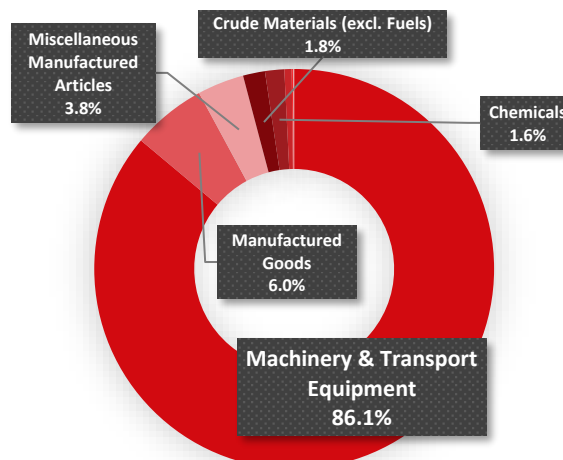
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

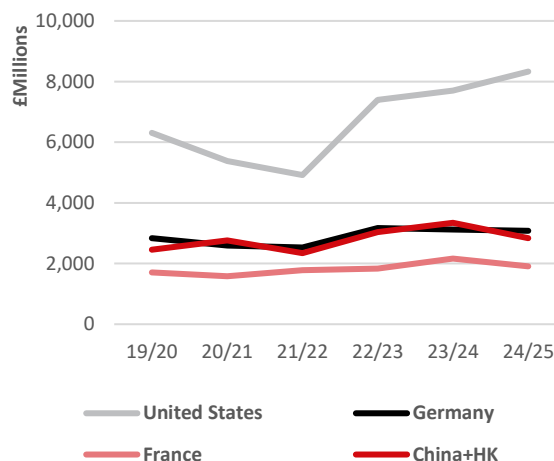
### Trade Insights

- The West Midlands' goods exports to China (inc. HK) fell **15.3%** to **£2.83 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, the **sharpest** decline among UK regions, yet **second** in overall value.
- This fall was largely driven by a **25.4%**, **£587 million** drop in road vehicle exports – the region's biggest export to China – mirroring declines seen across other regions in this category.
- The West Midlands was China's **top** UK source for road vehicles, 'animal- and vegetable-based oils' and 'telecoms and audio-equipment', and a **leading** exporter of 'raw hides', 'basic minerals and fertiliser materials', and 'metal ores and scrap'.

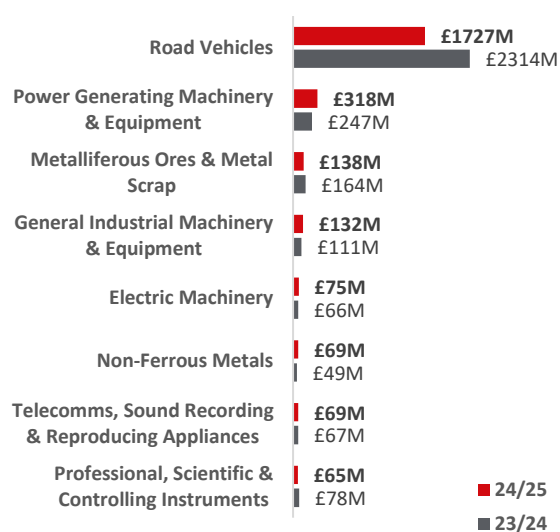
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



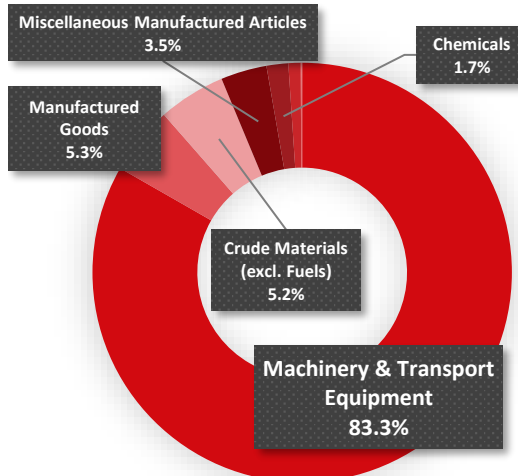
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

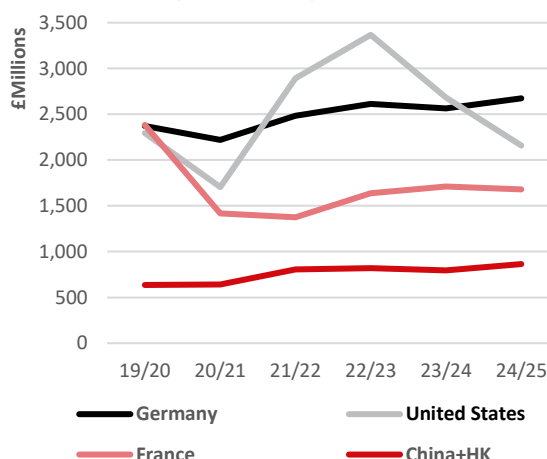
### Trade Insights

- Welsh exports to China (inc. HK) rose **8.5%** to a record **£864 million** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, reversing a **2.7%** fall in the previous period.
- This turnaround was driven by a **79.6%** rise in Wales' top export category, 'power-generating machinery and equipment', likely reflecting overhaul and service exports of jet engines and modules carried out near Nantgarw in south Wales.
- Exports of 'machinery specialised for particular industries' fell **29.1%**, possibly reflecting fewer wing and aerostructure shipments from Broughton in north Wales, due to production bottlenecks reported in 2024/25.

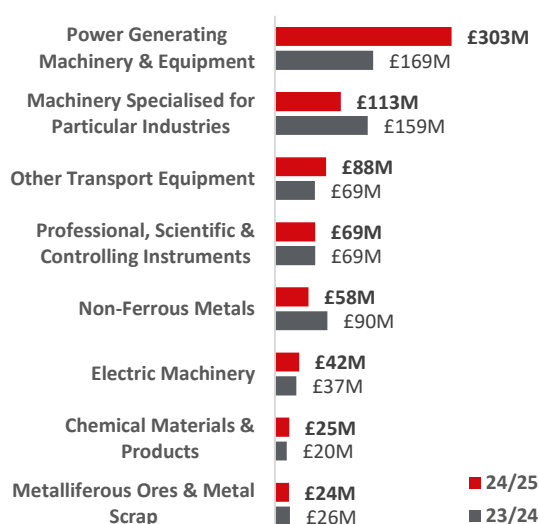
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



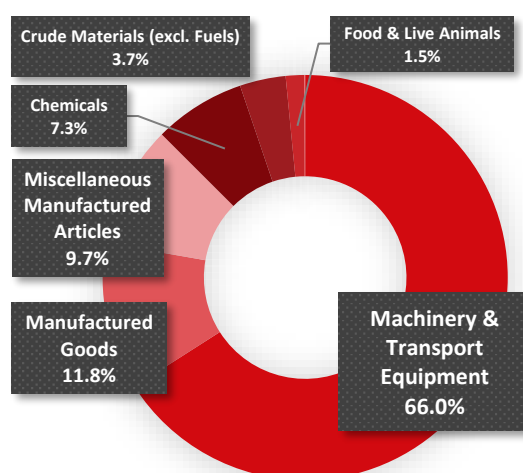
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China



Top 8 Export Subcategories to China 24/25 (£M)



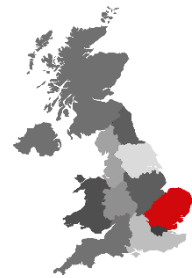
Export Distribution by Main Category 24/25

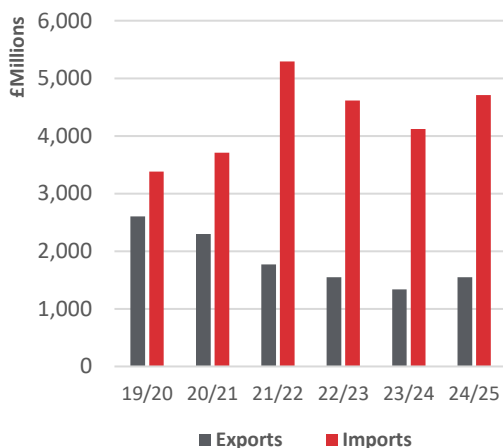

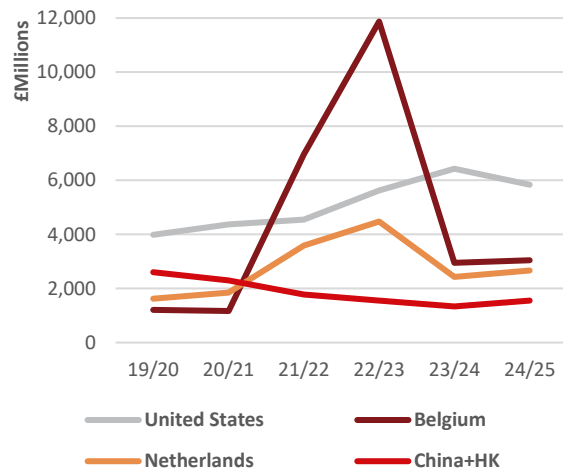
### Trade Insights

- Exports from the East of England to China and Hong Kong rose **16.0%** to **£1.55 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, reversing the **14.0%** fall recorded a year earlier.
- Exports of medicinal and pharmaceutical products grew **10.7%** to **£371 million**, driven by a major pharma player and the growing biotech cluster in Cambridge.
- The East was also the **top** UK exporter of ‘live animals’, ‘meat’, ‘sugar and honey products’, ‘crude rubber and other raw materials’, and ‘office and data-processing machines’, reflecting the region’s agricultural strengths, key industrial shipments routed through Felixstowe port in Suffolk, and Cambridge’s advanced tech manufacturing.

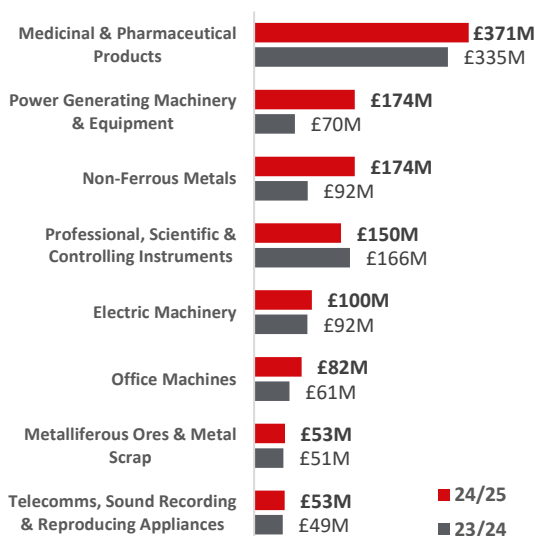
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



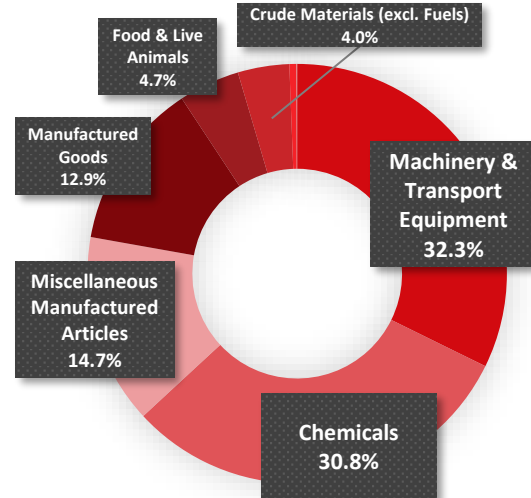
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

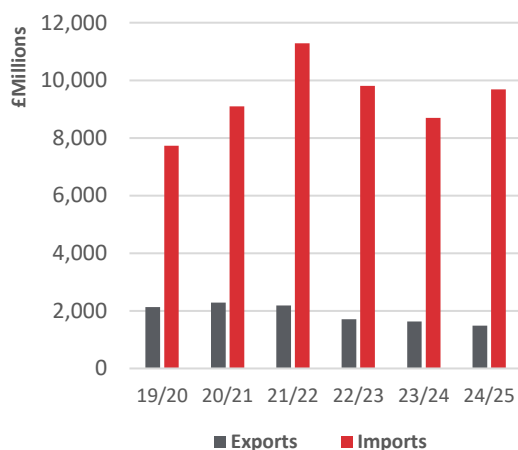

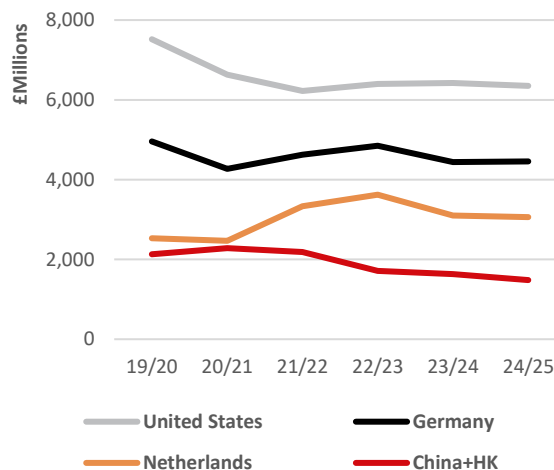
### Trade Insights

- The South East – the UK’s **largest** exporter overall – saw exports to China (inc. HK) fall **9.1%** to **£1.48 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, a fourth consecutive decline.
- The sharpest drop among major exports was a **50.4%** fall in vehicle exports, possibly due to a drop in luxury car exports and consistent with broader declines across UK regions.
- The South East’s **top** export to China, ‘professional, scientific, and controlling instruments’, fell **8.6%** to **£165 million**, reflecting a mix of high-value technologies produced around Oxford and Buckinghamshire, from semiconductor etching tools and benchtop analytical instruments to CT and MRI scanners.

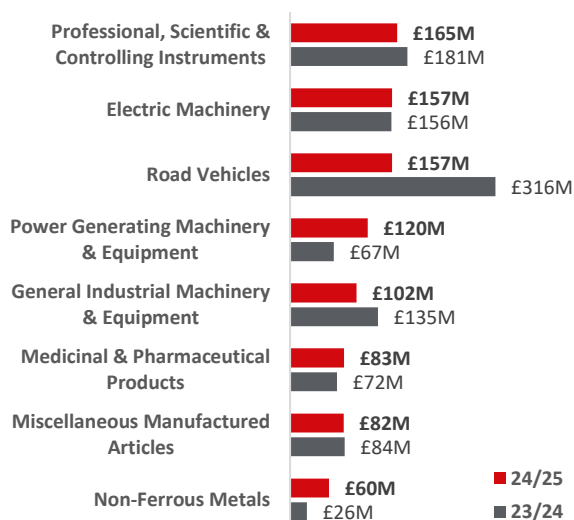
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



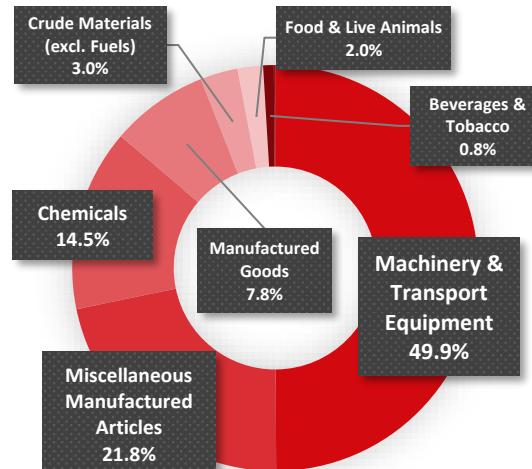
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

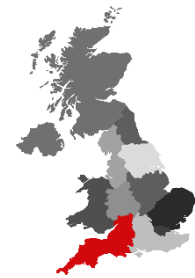

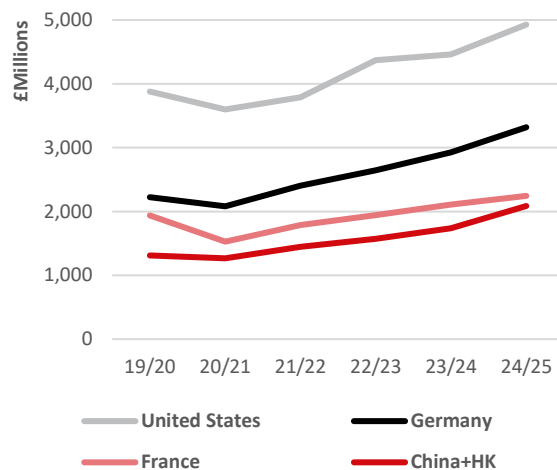
### Trade Insights

- Exports from England's South West region to China (inc. HK) rose **20.0%** to **£2.09 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025.
- Power generating machinery exports surged **42.4%** to **£1.2 billion**, including gas/steam turbines, generators, renewable-energy equipment, and power-plant components.
- The South West was the UK's **second-highest** exporter of 'other transport equipment' to China, which may include aircraft parts, engines, naval vessels, and luxury yachts.
- China accounted for about **1%** of regional GDP based on the latest comparable figures, making the South West the **third** most reliant on China trade after the Midlands.

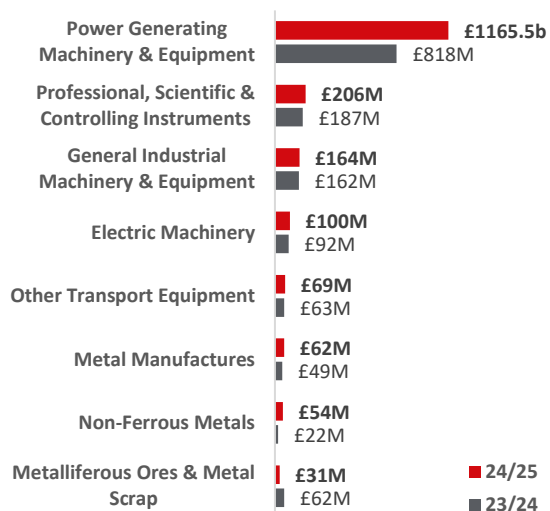
*Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019*



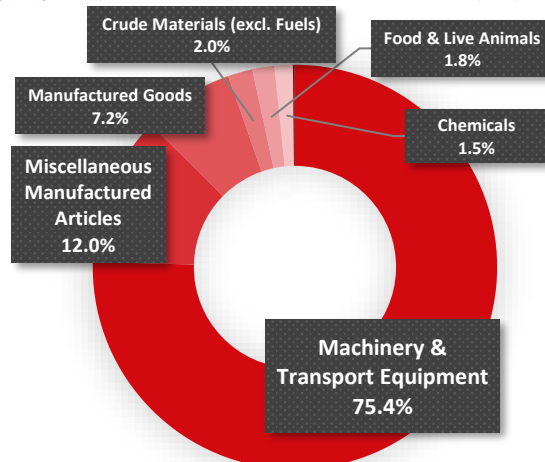
*Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China*



*Top 10 Export Subcategories to China in 24/25 (£M)*



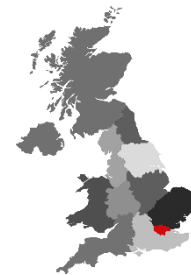

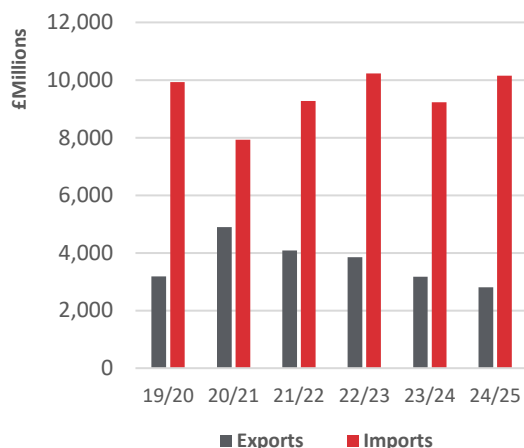

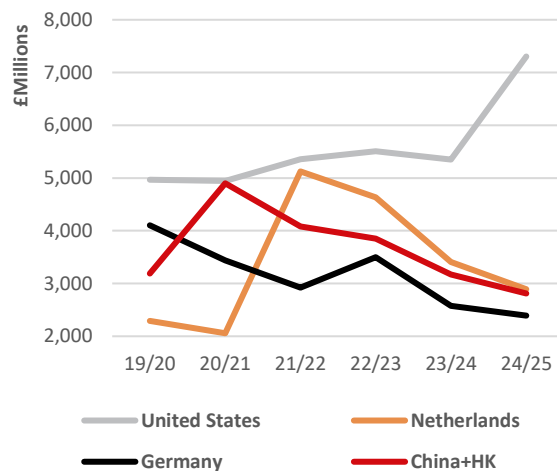
### Trade Insights

- Exports from London to China (inc. HK) fell by **11.4%** to **£2.81 billion**, making the capital the UK's **third-largest** exporter to China.
- Exports of non-ferrous metals (those without iron) rose **66.9%** to **£607 million**, possibly reflecting China's decision to widen the range of recycled aluminium and copper it accepts in November 2024, followed by tariff cuts on select recycled copper and aluminium raw materials in January 2025.
- A former leading category, 'miscellaneous manufactured articles' (likely including high-end designer goods, luxury cosmetics, and bespoke items), fell **5.6%** to **£520 million**.

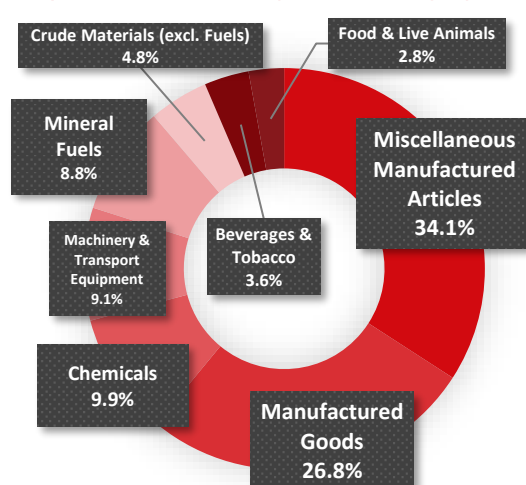
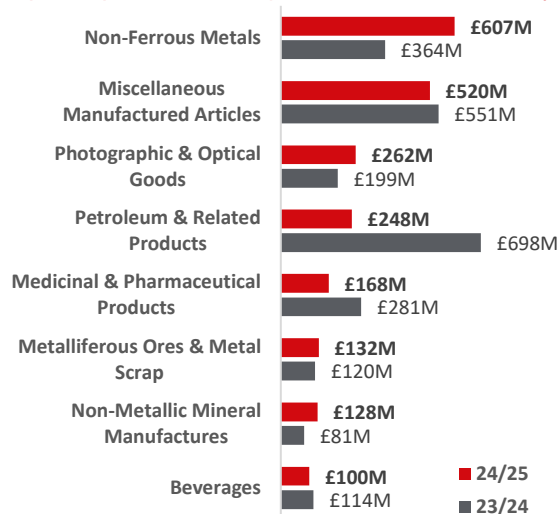
### Yearly Trade with China since 2019



### Regional Exports to Top Partners and China



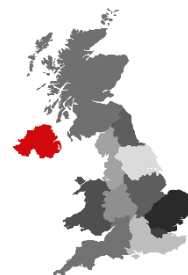
### Top 8 Export Subcategories to China 24/25 (£M) Export Distribution by Main Category 24/25

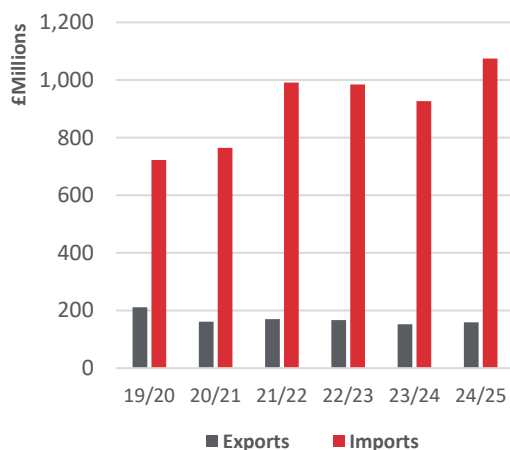

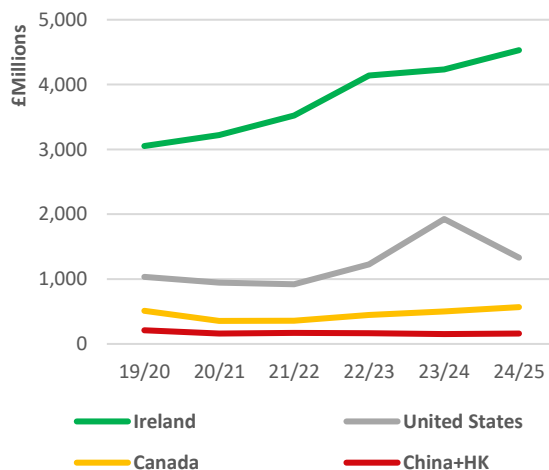
### Trade Insights

- Northern Ireland's exports to China (inc. HK) grew by **4.6%** to **£159 million** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, reversing the decline seen in 2023-4.
- Growth was driven by a **75.7%** rise in furniture exports to **£30.5 million**, a sector known for its skilled woodworking and bespoke design.
- Medicines, previously Northern Ireland's top export to China, fell by **10.4%** to **£29.8 million**. It remains a relatively small but export-focused sector, centred on a few major manufacturers and a growing group of specialist biotech firms with strong regulatory standards, solid university links, and a reputation for reliable, high-value production.

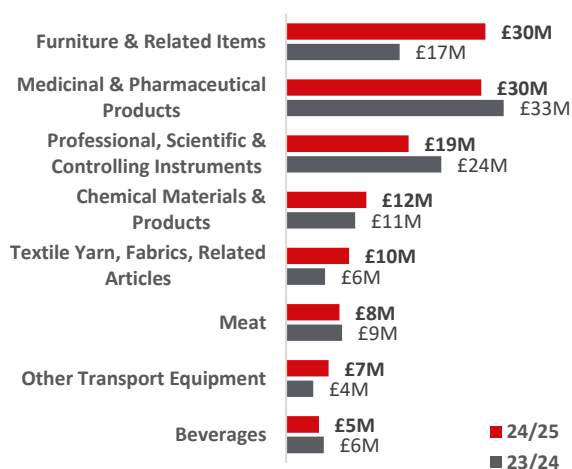
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



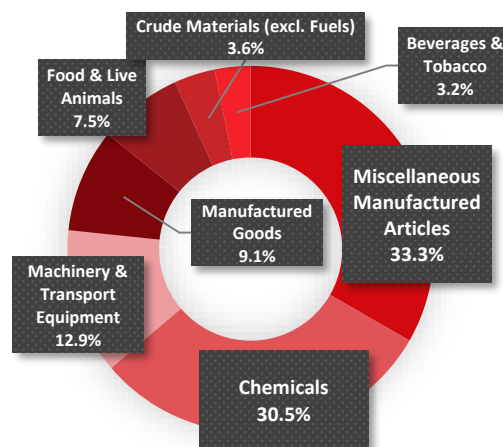
Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

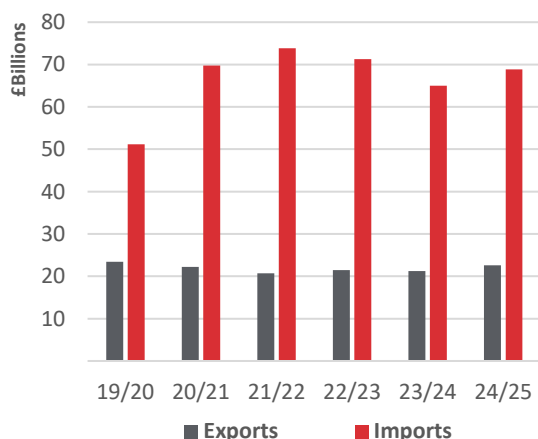

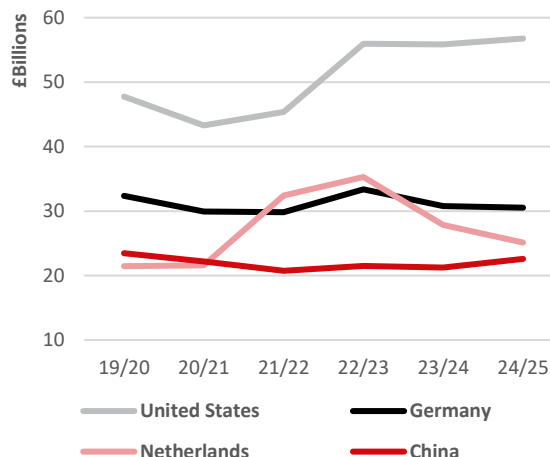
### Trade Insights

- UK goods exports to China (inc. HK) grew **6.4%** to **£22.6 billion** in the four quarters to Q2 2025, reversing the previous decline and making China the UK's **fourth** largest goods export market.
- Of the UK's total exports to China, **£13.1 billion (58.1%)** went to Mainland China and **£9.5 billion (41.9%)** to Hong Kong.
- A **29.8%** fall in road vehicles created a **£1.1 billion** shortfall, but a **29.5%** rise in power-generating machinery added **£1.4 billion** to the national economy, pushing the overall balance back into positive territory.
- London's **58.3%** rise in non-ferrous metal exports was likely linked to Chinese policy changes, underscoring the importance of policy reform for business success.

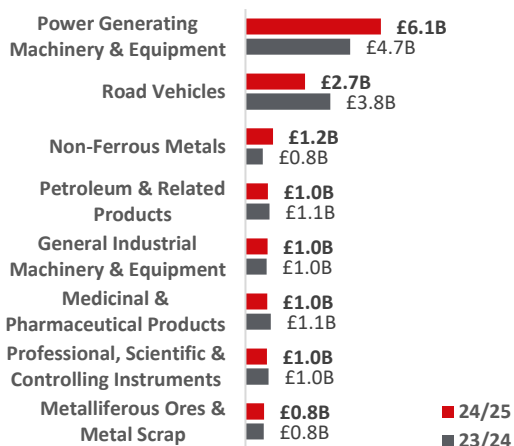
Yearly Goods Trade with China since 2019



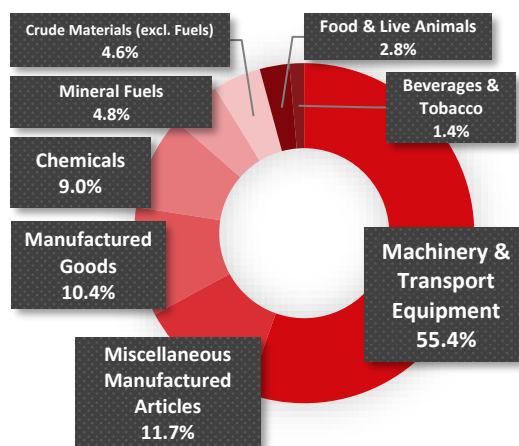
UK Goods Exports to Top-3 Partners and China

Export Distribution by Main Category 24/25



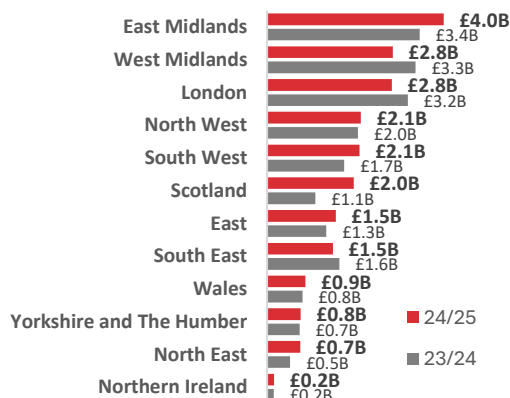

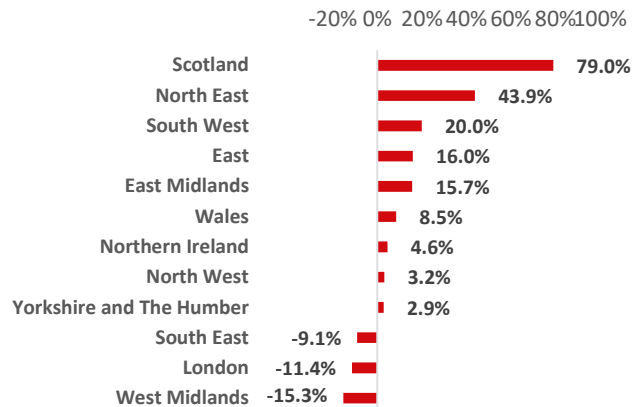
### Comparative Regional Insights

- Top UK exporters were East Midlands (£3.98bn), West Midlands (£2.83bn), London (£2.81bn), making up 18.5%, 13.3%, and 13.2% of total goods to China (inc. HK).
- Scotland (79.0%), North East (43.9%), and South West (20.0%) saw the **fastest** growth in its exports to China (inc. HK).
- **Nine** out of 12 UK areas saw China export growth in 24/25, up from **four** in 23/24.
- **Only** the East Midlands ran a **trade surplus** with China.
- Out of UK regions, East Midlands was the **most reliant** on Hong Kong trade (84% of its 'China trade'). Ireland was the **most reliant** on trade with Mainland China (86%).

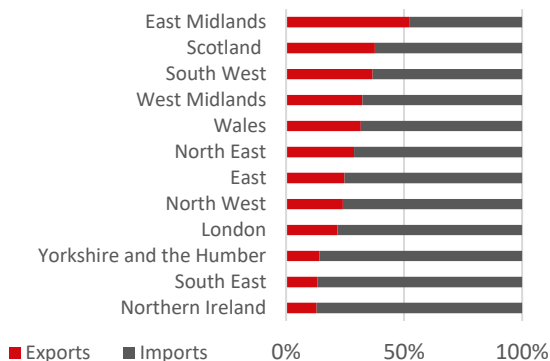
### Regional Exports to China 24-5 (£B)



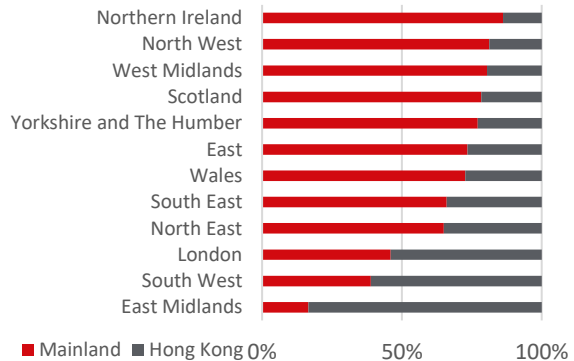
### Regional Growth in China Goods Exports (%)



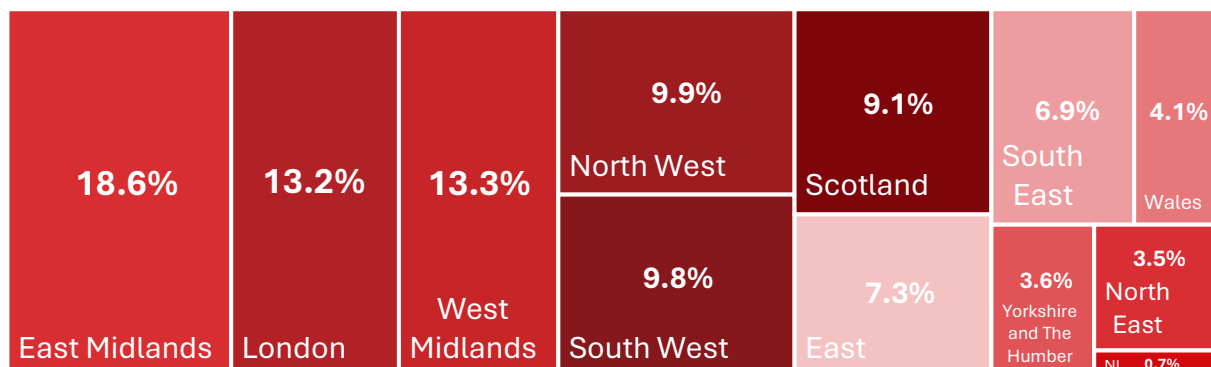
### Balance of Trade with China 24-5 (%)
